Purpose: Update on Probation Monitoring for Q1 and Q2 - FY 2022-2023

Background:

This is a report on the Board's Probation Monitoring Program for the first and second quarter of FY 2022-2023. Please refer to attachment (A) which contains the probation statistics for FY 2022-2023.

Analysis:

For the first quarter and second quarters, there were two additional licensees placed on probation, two licensees successfully completed probation, and one probation terminated/revoked bringing the total number of licensees on probation to 33 at the end of the second quarter. These licensees were placed on probation for various causes. Out of the 33 licensees on probation, 9 probationers continue to toll as they were either residing out of state or have an inactive license status.

Of the 24 licensees that were not tolling, 6 were enrolled and participating in the Board's Drug and Alcohol Recovery Monitoring Program at the end of the second quarter, equaling about 25% of all licensees on probation that weren't tolling. One licensee completed the Alcohol Recovery Monitoring Program in the first quarter.

Additionally, the Board revoked the probation of one licensee due to non-compliance with his probation terms and conditions. His license was revoked by a default decision. There is one current open investigation initiated in the second quarter.
