Background:

This is a report on the Board's Probation Program for the first quarter of FY 2025-2026.

Analysis:

<u>Probation Program Updates:</u>

The Board has thirty-one (31) current probationers who have been placed on probation for various causes. Of the 31 probationers, five (5) are tolling out of state and not receiving credit towards the completion of probation.

Of the 31 licensees on probation, four (4) are participating in the Board's Diversion Program. In addition to the four Board referrals the diversion program has three (3) other licensees participating in their program as self-referrals.

In this first quarter the Board referred a probationer to the Attorney General's Office and requested a new Accusation and Petition to Revoke Probation to be filed. This probationer was placed on probation here in CA but has been tolling for several years. Most recently, the state where they reside took disciplinary action against them for similar reasons why they had been placed on probation here in CA. As soon as this Board received notice of the out of state discipline, the Board took the necessary action to refer the matter to the Attorney Generals Office.

In addition to monitoring the probationers, the Probation Program has been assisting the Executive Director with drafting of the proposed language for the Board's disciplinary guidelines and the regulatory language for the penalty relief fees which you will be hearing about later today.
